Well strap in, because you are about to meet the legends..

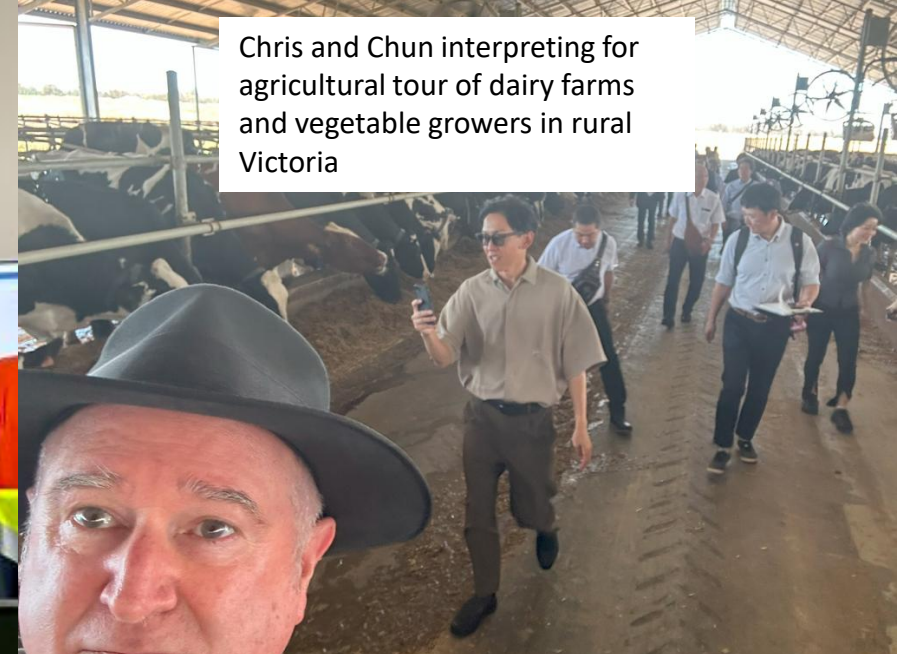

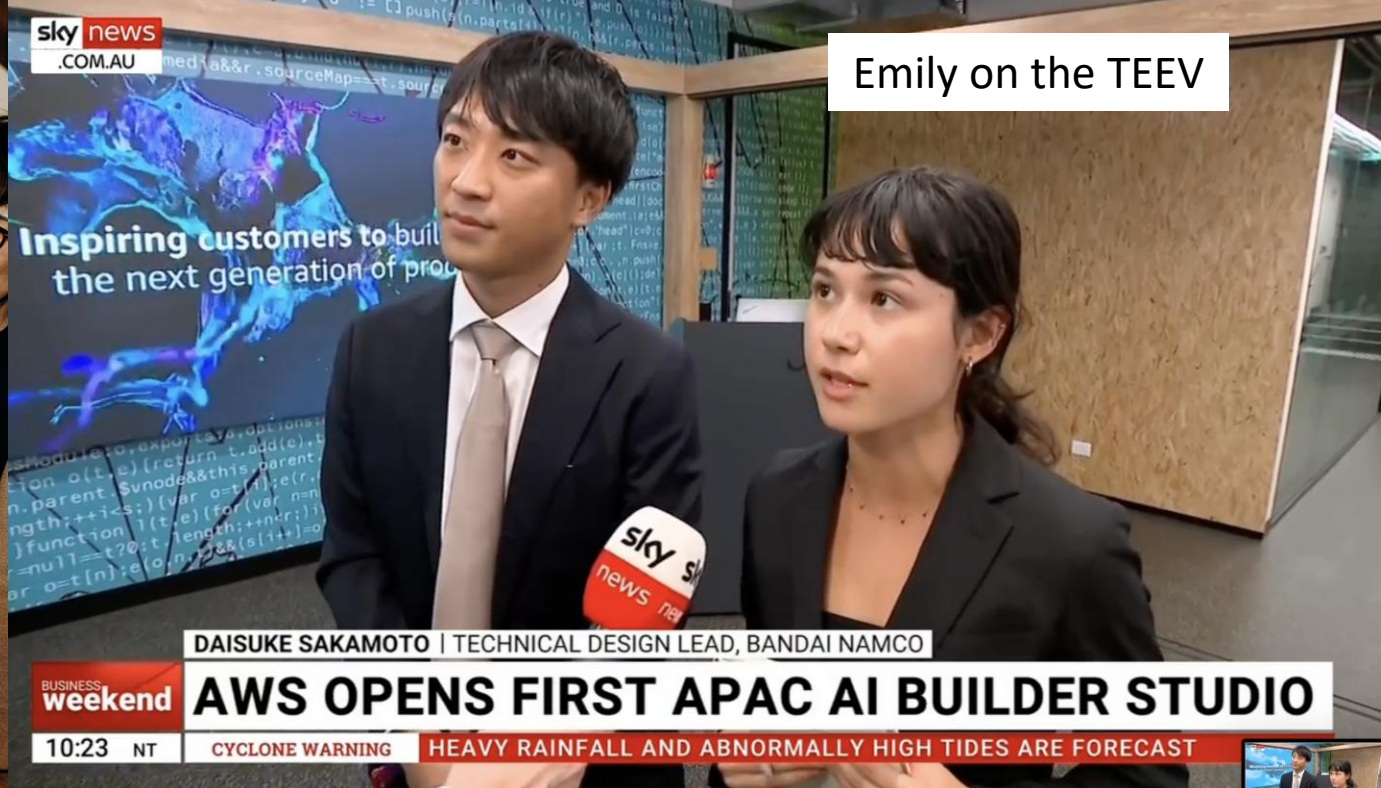

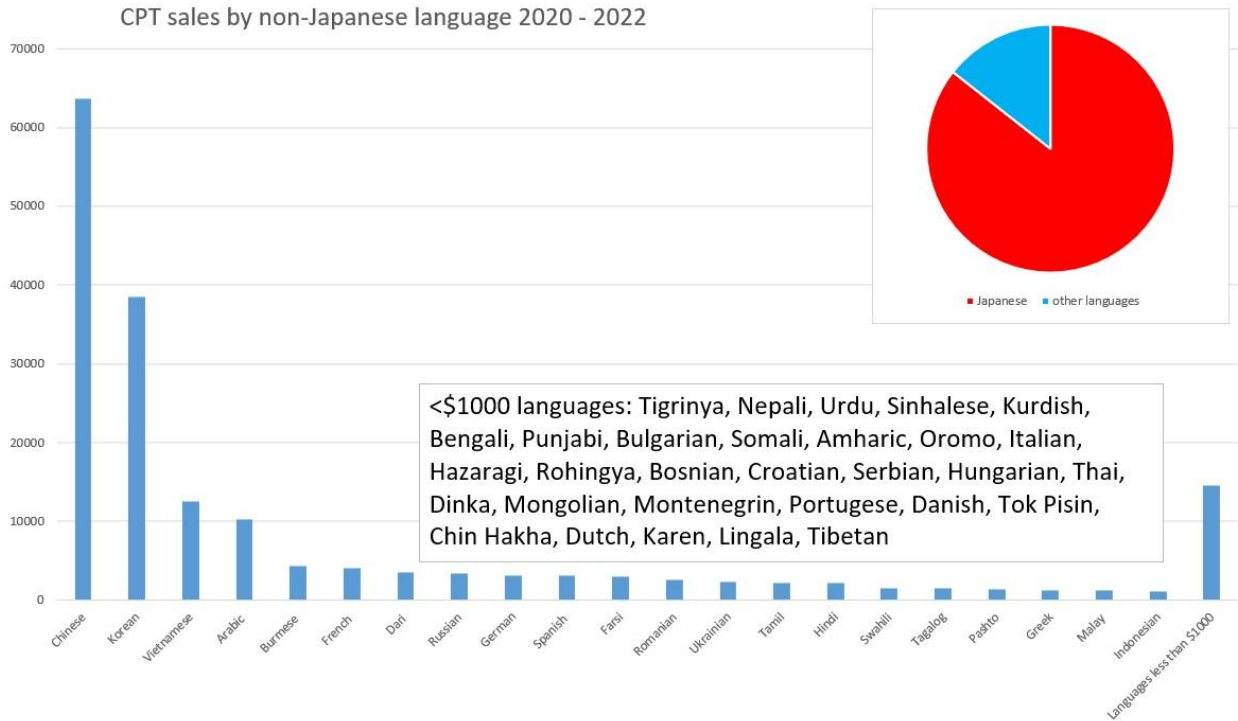
Also had dumplings and peace with Sarina in Footscray.

In Singapore you can just have beer for breakfast apparently.

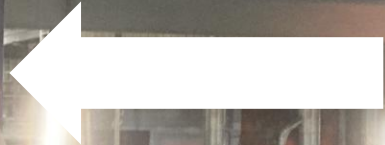
What? WHAT??

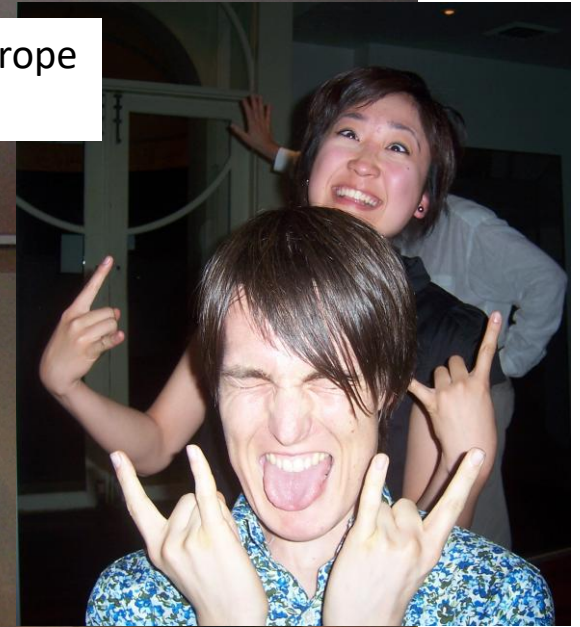

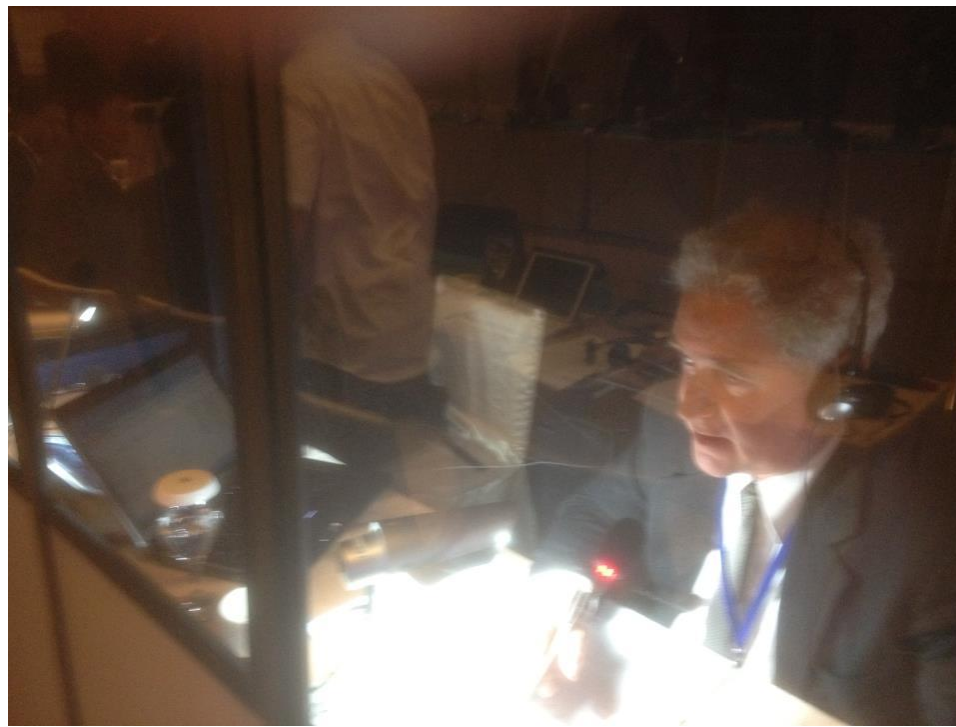

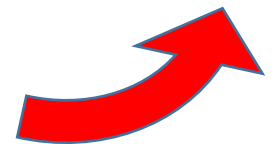


Midori and David Coxhell outside the construction site for the Consul General's Residence in Kobe, designed and built by by Australian architects, trademen and with Australian materials.

He was an interpreter during the war and among other duties had to read out the sentences, including death sentences, for various Japanese officers during the war crimes trials in Bougainville

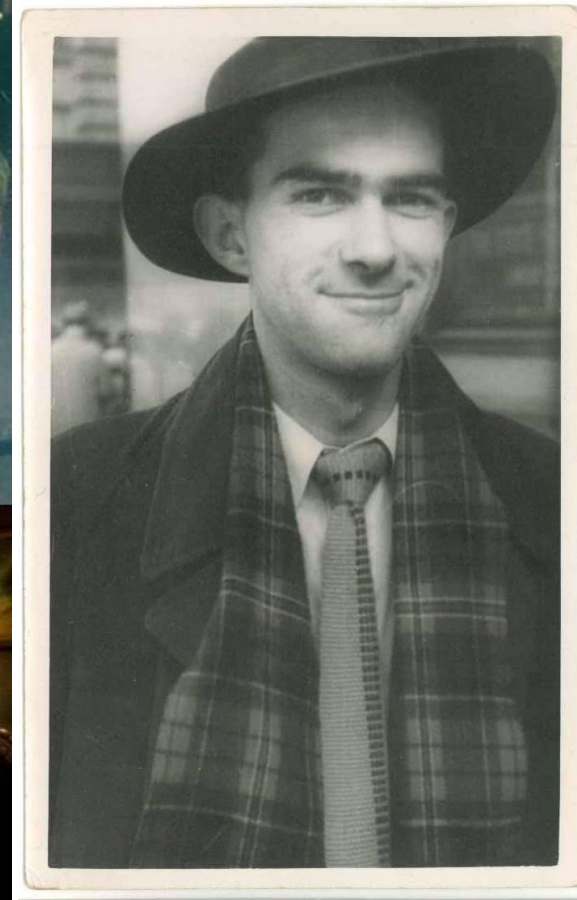




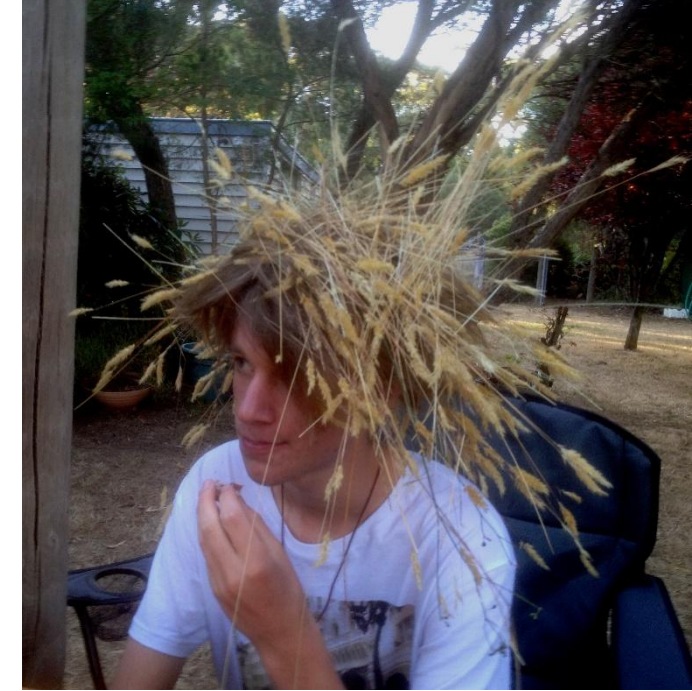
My Maternal Grandparents meeting Chou En Lai (with interpreting support) year of my birth 1960. I was the first grandson.
